Bills in the News: Additional Homestead Exemption

### **FAC Priority: Opioid Epidemic**

SB788(Sen. Clemons) – related to marketing practices for substance abuse services was heard andpassed on Wednesday, 4/19/17 in the Senate Rules Committee. The bill is now headed to the Senatefloor. The House companion HB 807 has beenplaced on the House Special Order Calendar for 2nd reading onTuesday, 4/25/17.



#### SB 588 (Sen.Passidomo) is the

companionbill to <u>HB 249</u> (Rep. Rommel) encourages first responders to reportcertain overdose incident data to the Department of Health within 120 hours ofthe incident through the existing state Emergency Medical Service Tracking andReporting System (or other appropriate method) and requires the Department tomake the information available to local government agencies no later than 120hours after receipt. <u>SB 588</u> was passed onMonday, 4/17/17 by the Senate Criminal Justice committee and is now scheduledto be heard by the Senate Rules committee on 4/25/17. <u>HB 249</u> and Similar <u>HB 61</u> has been placed on the special-ordercalendar for 2nd reading on Tuesday, 4/25/17.

SB 150(Rep. Steube) / HB 477(Rep. Boyd) creates crimes of trafficking in fentanyl and synthetic drugs and increases penalties for some drug related offenses. This is the prioritylegislation for the Florida Sheriffs Association. SB 150 was passed by the Senate Judiciary committee on Wednesday, 4/19/17 and is nowscheduled to be heard by the Senate Appropriations committee on Tuesday 4/25/17. HB 477 was passed by the full House on 4/20/17.

The bill isscheduled to be heard during the House Health

and Human Services committee on Monday, April 24, 2017.


### **FAC Priority: Tax Reform**

HouseProposed Tax Cut Package - HB 7109 - The proposed 2017 House tax cutpackage has been placed on the House Special Order Calendar for 4/25/17. Based on FAC's analysis of the proposed tax cut concepts, Counties will experience an estimated \$33million recurring impact statewide.

10% Assessment Limit on Non-Homestead
Property - HB 21 (Rep. Burton)has been substituted for SB76 (Sen. Lee) and has been scheduled for 3rd reading and finalpassage on Wednesday 4/26/2017

SB 1748 (Sen.Stewart) was heard and passed in the Senate Environmental Preservation and Conservation committee on Wednesday, 4/19/17.

SB532 (Sen. Galvano) related to public notices of pollution was passed off the Senate Floor on 4/18/17 and is now in House messages.

<u>SB 10</u> (Sen. Bradley) – Relating to Water Resourcespassed off the Senate floor and is now in House messages.

The following provides information regarding legislation that may significantly impact Florida's counties.

### Health & Human Services / Public Safety

#### Clerks of the Circuit Court: SB 2056

- SB 2506 (SenateAppropriations) / HB 7051 (Rep. Byrd) -Relating to Clerks of the Circuit Court
- SB 2506, whichprovides for additional funds for clerks and a mechanism to adjust for budgetfluctuations during the year, was passed off the Senate Floor, received bythe House which took up the bill and amended the legislation and ultimatelyagreed to include the subject matter of the bill as a part of the upcomingbudget conference.
- HB 7051 revises the way in which clerk of court budgets would be approved.
   Specifically, itremoves the duties of LBC regarding budgets of Florida Clerks of CourtOperations Corporation & clerks of court; revises duties of thecorporation; revises budgeting requirements for court-related costs of clerks of court; requires cost of certain changes in court rules & administrativeorders to be reviewed by Criminal Justice Estimating Conference; revises duties of JAC relating to budgets & payroll of clerks of court. HB 7051 has been placed on the special-order calendar for 2ndreading on 4/25/17.

#### **Drones - SB 832 / HB 1027**

- HB 1027 was passed off the House floor on4/20/17.
- SB 832 was heard and passed on 4/19/17 by the Senate Communications, Energy, and Utilities committee. The bill is scheduled to be heard by the Senate Rules committee on 4/25/17.

#### Civil Citation Program for Juveniles - SB 196 / HB 205

- HB 205 was passed by the House Judiciarycommittee on 4/20/17 and is now headed
  to the House floor. The bill wassubstantially amended to removed mandatory civil
  citations and merelyencourages the use of such diversion programs and provides for
  the expunction of juvenile records who successfully complete the program.

PublicRecords -SB 80 / HB 163

- SB 80 and HB 163 have bothbeen passed as of 4/20/17 and will be submitted to the Governor

#### Worker's Compensation -

### SB 1582/ HB 7085

- The bills provide concepts for reform of existing worker's compensation system. SB 1582 (Sen.Bradley) was passed in the Senate Rules committee on 4/19/17 and is now headedto the Senate floor. The Senate versionwould cap attorneys' fees at \$250 and would require individual insurers to filetheir own rate requests rather than the requests being filed by the NationalCouncil on Compensation Insurance. The bill now includes language that would deem multiple myeloma and non-Hodgkin's lymphoma to be occupational diseases for firefighters for purposes of workers' compensation. HB 7085(Rep. Burgess) was passed off the House floor on 4/19/17 and will now awaitaction by the Senate. Among other provisions, the House version of the workers' compensation reform would limitclaimants' attorney's fees to \$150.

### LocalReferenda - HB 139 / SB 278

- Thebills stipulate when local governments must have their local referendaelections and by what threshold they must pass. <u>SB 278</u> was heard and passed on Monday, 4/17/17 by the SenateCommunity Affairs committee. <u>HB 139</u> has been placedon the House special order calendar for 2nd reading on 4/25/17.

**Local Government Fiscal Transparency**– <u>HB 7065</u> (House Ways & Means Comm.)

Amongvarious provisions, the bill provides for:

- a)Votingrecords related to Board actions to increase taxes and the issuance of taxsupported debt.
- b)Theprovision of online access to historical TRIM notices by parcel.
- c)Additional requirement for public meetings and notice for local option tax increases and tax-supported debt is suances.
- d)Therequirement for local governments to conduct a debt affordability analysis prior to approving new long-term tax-supported debt.
- e)Therequirement that local governments include compliance with transparencyrequirements in their annual audit.

Currently, there is no Senatecompanion bill to <u>HB7065</u>

Thebill was heard and passed by the House Government Accountability Committee on4/25/17. The bill has now been placed onthe House special order calendar for 4/25/17.

Vacation Rentals - SB 188 / HB 425

- SB 188 was heard and passed on Monday, 4/17/2017, during the Senate Community
  Affairs committee meeting. The bill was amended to allow existingordinances to be
  amended to be less restrictive or add measures that reducedthe regulatory burdens
  on veterans that own vacation rental property. HB 425 is scheduled to be heard by
  the House Commerce committeeon 4/24/17.

- HB 599 was passed off the House floor on 4/19/17 and now awaits action by the Senate. SB 534 was heard and passed by the Senate Appropriations committee on 4/20/17 and now heads to the Senate floor.

### Community Redevelopment Agencies - SB 1770 / HB 13

- Bothbills require substantial changes to the management of CRAs. <u>SB 1770</u> failed to pass the SenateAppropriations Subcommittee on Transportation, Tourism, and EconomicDevelopment. <u>HB 13</u> was heard andpassed by the House Government Accountability committee and has been placed on the House special order calendar for 2nd reading on 4/25/17.
