#### **LEGISLATIVE PREEMPTION ALERT #1**

A tax shift is not a tax cut:

Vote No on Senate Resolution to Increase the Homestead Exemption

Tuesday, April 25<sup>th</sup>, 2017 - 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading; Wednesday, April 26<sup>th</sup>, 2017 3<sup>rd</sup> Reading and Final Vote by the Full House of Representatives.

Increasing the Homestead Property Tax Exemption

<u>HJR 7105</u> by the House Ways and Means Committee and Rep. LaRosa proposes a constitutional amendment that would increase the homestead exemption by \$25,000, creating a super-exemption of \$75,000 for the first \$100,000 of the value of homestead property. While homestead property owners may appreciate the exemption, it shifts the tax burden to our local business and non-homesteaded property owners.

- This is a tax SHIFT not a tax CUT. The tax burden will be placed on local business owners and non-homestead property owners who must choose between more taxes or fewer services.
- Small counties hit the hardest: Florida's 29 fiscally constrained counties that are at or near the 10 mill cap will have no choice but to cut the limited services they are barely able to provide today.
- Citizens will get less with less: The additional exemption means that counties that choose to maintain their current millage rates must make tough choices about the services provided to their citizens.

#### **2017 PRIORITIES UPDATE**

#### **OPIOID ABUSE** – LISA HURLEY, ESQ.

SB 788 (Sen. Clemons) – related to marketing practices for substance abuse services was heard and passed on Wednesday, 4/19/17 in the Senate Rules Committee. The bill is now headed to the Senate floor. The House companion HB 807 has been placed on the House Special Order Calendar for 2<sup>nd</sup> reading on Tuesday, 4/25/17.

SB 588 (Sen. Passidomo) is the companion bill to HB 249 (Rep. Rommel) encourages first responders to report certain overdose incident data to the Department of Health within 120 hours of the incident through the existing state Emergency Medical Service Tracking and Reporting System (or other appropriate method) and requires the Department to make the information available to local government agencies no later than 120 hours after receipt. SB 588 was passed on Monday, 4/17/17 by the Senate Criminal Justice committee and is now scheduled to be heard by the Senate Rules committee on 4/25/17. HB 249 and Similar HB 61 have been placed on the special-order calendar for 2<sup>nd</sup> reading on Tuesday, 4/25/17.

SB 150 (Rep. Steube) / HB 477 (Rep. Boyd) creates crimes of trafficking in fentanyl and synthetic drugs and increases penalties for some drug related offenses. This is the priority legislation for the Florida Sheriffs Association. SB 150 was passed by the Senate Judiciary committee on Wednesday, 4/19/17 and is now scheduled to be heard by the Senate Appropriations committee on Tuesday 4/25/17. HB 477 was passed by the full House on 4/20/17.

<u>SB 406</u> (Sen. Bradley) was heard and passed on Tuesday, 4/18/17 during a meeting of the Senate Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services. The bill is scheduled to be heard during the Senate Appropriations committee on Tuesday 4/25/17. <u>HB 1397</u> (Rep. Rodrigues) was heard and passed on Tuesday, 4/18/17 in the House Appropriations Committee. The bill is scheduled to be heard during the House Health and Human Services committee on Monday, April 24, 2017.

### TAX REFORM / LOCAL REVENUE ENHANCEMENT – LAURA YOUMANS, ESQ.

House Proposed Tax Cut Package - <u>HB 7109</u> - The proposed 2017 House tax cut package has been placed on the House Special Order Calendar for 4/25/17. Based on <u>FAC's analysis</u> of the proposed tax cut concepts, Counties will experience an estimated \$33 million recurring impact statewide.

**10% Assessment Limit on Non-Homestead Property** - <u>HB 21</u> (Rep. Burton) has been substituted for <u>SB 76</u> (Sen. Lee) and has been scheduled for 3<sup>rd</sup> reading and final passage on Wednesday 4/26/2017

**Additional Homestead Exemption** - Please review FAC's new County by County impact analysis of <u>SJR</u> 1774 (Sen. Lee) and <u>HB 7105</u> (Rep. LaRosa) here. HB 7015 has been placed on Special Order for 4/25/17

**Renewable Energy** - <u>SB 90</u> (Sen. Brandes) was passed unanimously on 4/20/2017 by the Senate Appropriations committee and is now headed to the Senate floor. <u>HB 1351</u> (Rep. Rodrigues) was passed unanimously by the House Commerce committee on 4/19/17 and has now placed on the House special order calendar for 2<sup>nd</sup> reading on Tuesday, 4/25/17.

Local Business Taxes - <u>SB 330</u> (Sen. Stuebe) is scheduled to be heard in Senate Appropriations on 4/25/17. <u>HB 487</u> (Rep. Renner) is scheduled to be heard in the House Government Accountability committee on 4/25/17 as well.

<u>HB 285</u> (Rep. Fine) - Relating to Onsite Sewage Treatment and Disposal System Inspections has been passed by the Full House as of 4/20/17. <u>SB 1748</u> (Sen. Stewart) was heard and passed in the Senate Environmental Preservation and Conservation committee on Wednesday, 4/19/17.

SB 532 (Sen. Galvano) related to public notices of pollution was passed off the Senate Floor on 4/18/17 and is now in House messages.

<u>SB 10</u> (Sen. Bradley) – Relating to Water Resources passed off the Senate floor and is now in House messages.

SB 2506 (Senate Appropriations) / HB 7051 (Rep. Byrd) - Relating to Clerks of the Circuit Court

SB 832 (Sen. Young) / HB 1027 (Rep. Yarborough) - Relating to Drones

HB 1027 was passed off the House floor on 4/20/17.

<u>SB 832</u> was heard and passed on 4/19/17 by the Senate Communications, Energy, and Utilities committee. The bill is scheduled to be heard by the Senate Rules committee on 4/25/17.

SB 196 (Sen. Flores) / HB 205 (Rep. Ahern) - Relating to Juvenile Civil Citation & Similar Diversion Programs:

<u>HB 205</u> was passed by the House Judiciary committee on 4/20/17 and is now headed to the House floor. The bill was substantially amended to removed mandatory civil citations and merely encourages the use of such diversion programs and provides for the expunction of juvenile records who successfully complete the program.
