- <u>10:00am:</u> Senate Community Affairs will continue its discussion of **state and local regulation of vacation rentals** by taking public testimony on the issue. The committee will also hear a presentation on **Community Redevelopment Agencies (CRAs)**. Two bills will be considered: **SB 192** by Sen. Baxley (Public Meetings) and **SB 272** by Sen. Brandes (Local Tax Referenda).
- <u>10:00am:</u> Senate Health Policy will hear an update from DOH on implementation of **SB 8-A (Medical** Use of Marijuana).
- <u>3:00pm:</u> Senate Communications, Energy, and Public Utilities will consider **SB 90** by Sen. Perry (Use of Wireless Communications Devices while Driving).
- 3:00pm: Senate Judiciary will consider SB 186 by Sen. Hutson (Resign-to-Run Law).

Wednesday, October 25

- <u>9:00am:</u> House Natural Resources and Public Lands Subcommittee will consider **HB 203** by Rep. Willhite (Environmental Regulation Commission), which would require the Governor to fill vacancies on the ERC within 90 days. The committee will also be updated on implementation of **SB 10 (2017)**.
- <u>9:00am:</u> Senate Appropriations will discuss **Hurricane Irma expenditures and responses**, as well as the potential impacts of **Hurricane Maria evacuees** from Puerto Rico. The committee will also be updated on **medical marijuana implementation** and the **Low Income Pool**.
- <u>10:30am:</u> House Agriculture and Natural Resources Appropriations Subcommittee will hear from DACS, DEP, and FWC on land management funding.
- <u>1:00pm:</u> Senate Appropriations Subcommittee on Criminal and Civil Justice will hear from DJJ and DOC and review risk assessment tools in the criminal justice system.
- <u>1:00pm:</u> Senate Appropriations Subcommittee on Pre K-12 Education will the **fiscal impact of recent** hurricanes on public schools.
